## WHAT WILL BE CHANGING FOR YOU?

- **New barcodes**  
The new system forces us to provide a number of products with new barcodes. An overview of these can be found at [www.octoral.com](http://www.octoral.com).
- **MSDS will become SDS**  
MSDSs will also be revised and will now be called SDSs. From 1 June onwards they will be available at [www.octoral.com](http://www.octoral.com).
- **New warning statements**  
The pictograms will be superseded by 9 new pictograms and 2 signal words.
- **Item numbers**  
Item numbers will remain the same, though in a few cases the item number on

the box or the label may be given a suffix (e.g. /A or /B). You will be able to order your products in the familiar way.

- **2-layer labels**  
A number of products use 2-layer labels. Remove the top layer of the label to read safety information in other languages. This provides more space to enable us to ensure that the information is readily legible in the various languages.
